



"The Italian Roots of Western Culture"

Bologna, Bolzano, Mantua, Ferrara, Venice July 4 - July 15, 2005

This summer program will take participants on a twelve-day tour of northern Italy, exposing them to a rich cultural heritage stretching from the Bronze Age to the twentieth century. Participants will acquire resources relating to the teaching of history, art history, politics, religion, economics, and, of course, Italian, as they some of Italy's most important cultural centers. Visits will be made to Bologna, famous for its medieval towers and site of the first university in Europe (founded in 1088); to Mantua and Ferrara, centers of Italian renaissance art; to the alpine town of Bolzano and its famous "Ice Man" museum; and to Venice, a world cultural landmark—just to mention a few of the planned activities. Participants will also have the opportunity to learn some rudimentary Italian.

This trip will be led by Annastella Vester (PhD) and Matthew Vester (PhD). Annastella Vester is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Foreign Languages at WVU, where she coordinates the Italian program and the minor program in Italian Studies. She teaches beginning through advanced Italian grammar and Italian conversation and writing. Her own research focusses on literature and history under Italian Fascism. Matthew Vester is an Assistant Professor in the History Department where he teaches Western Civilization and courses on European and Italian history from the Middle Ages through the Renaissance and Early Modern Periods. He has published several articles on political culture in sixteenth-century Italy and France.

What Will Teachers Receive?

The trip includes roundtrip economy transatlantic flight from Washington Dulles International Airport to Bologna, Italy, airport transfers, lodging, 10 breakfasts, 4 dinners, travel (using public transportation), entrance fees and guides, and regular education activities led by 2 FACDIS professors. Participants are asked to contribute \$600 toward the trip; FACDIS will pay the remainder. Given the difficulties of predicting how many Euros the dollar will buy in six months, the total price remains uncertain, but the FACDIS share will be at least \$1,500. What are Costs to Teachers?

- Teachers must pay \$600 towards the cost of the trip. Payment is due in our office (check made payable to West Virginia University) by April 1, after acceptance into the program.
- Three hours of professional development graduate credit will be available through West Virginia University, for a cost to teacher of \$109.00 for the three hours.
- Participants must have a valid passport.
- Participants should obtain their own travel/medical protection insurance as well as necessary travel inoculations.

In addition, teachers must cover costs of transportation to/from Washington Dulles International Airport, all lunches, 6 dinners, optional tour activities and other personal costs.

Course Requirements:

As a follow-up to the trip, teachers will be required to submit lesson plans for a curriculum unit on Italy, and should teach it in their classes as appropriate during the year. Lesson plans should cover a minimum of 5-7 regular class periods. Lesson plans will be due in the FACDIS Office by **September 30, 2005.**

Selection of Participants:

In the very likely event that more applications are received than can be accepted, the personal statements/ essays will be important factors in the final selection process. You may want to discuss: how your experience in Italy will likely affect your classes (be as specific as possible); evidence of any teaching experiences which you wish to share (e.g. teaching awards); and how your professional goals and values might be fulfilled by this opportunity. Also, teachers who have met their past academic responsibilities with FACDIS will be given additional consideration.
